Learning Outside

- If your child is being collected by someone other than yourself please let a member of staff know when you drop your child off. They will need a known password to collect your child for obvious safety reasons.

Meet the teacher

This meeting is your opportunity to chat on a one to one basis about your child. This will last around 15 minutes.

Induction Sessions:

Stay and play

- Following the meet the teacher appointment, your child is invited into Foundation for a stay and play session on Wednesday 2nd July from 9.15am to 10.15am and Friday 4th July from 1.30pm-2.30pm.
- This session allows the children to play alongside others in our Foundation environment.
- If you would like stay on the school site, Mrs Perkins, our Family Support Worker will provide tea/coffee for parents.

- For all PE sessions, for safety reasons, children **must** remove earrings and watches and both boys and girls with long hair, must tie hair back.
- Those children with long hair are encouraged to come to school with their hair tied back to prevent the spread of head lice.
- We will inform you our PE days, your child will need to come into school that day wearing their PE kit.

Preparing your child for school

Getting dressed and undressed:

- Put on shoes -velcro is best!
- Practise fastening a zip.
- Put on a school jumper the right way round.
- Encourage them to care for themselves when they use the toilet but help is always available. Please provide a bag of spare clothes in a named carrier bag in case of accidents.
