The child who is more practical benefits from this. The knowledge that they gain is shared in their homes with parents and grandparents. Gardening with grandparents is therapeutic and just being together.

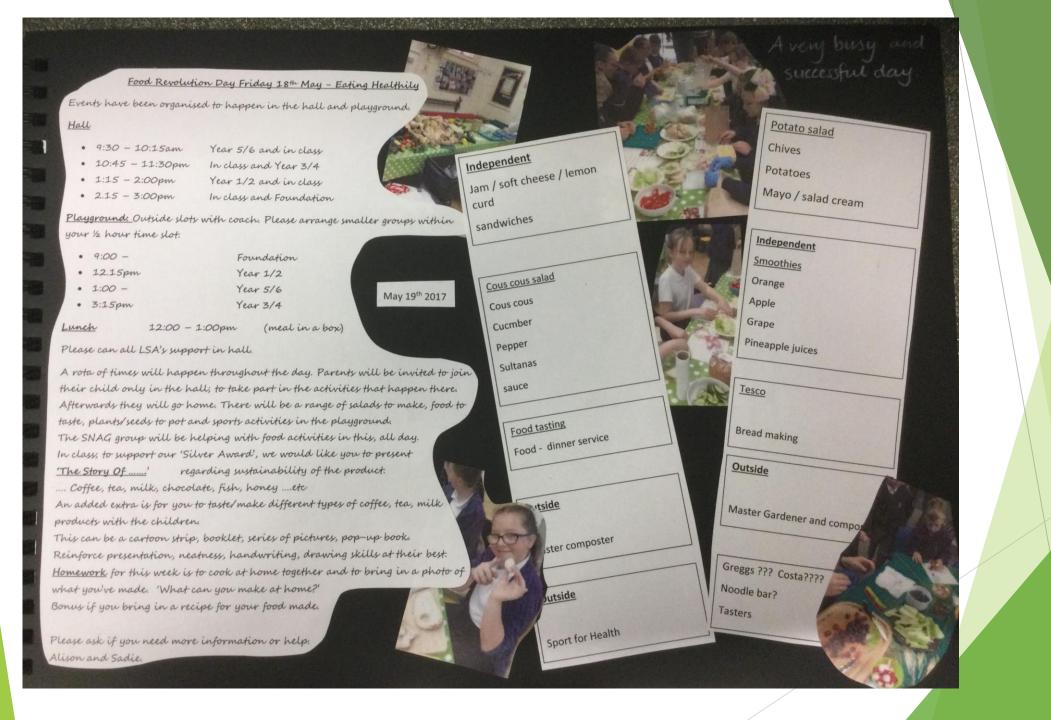

We believe that children will grow, like a seed, well-nourished with love, time, and a caring school.

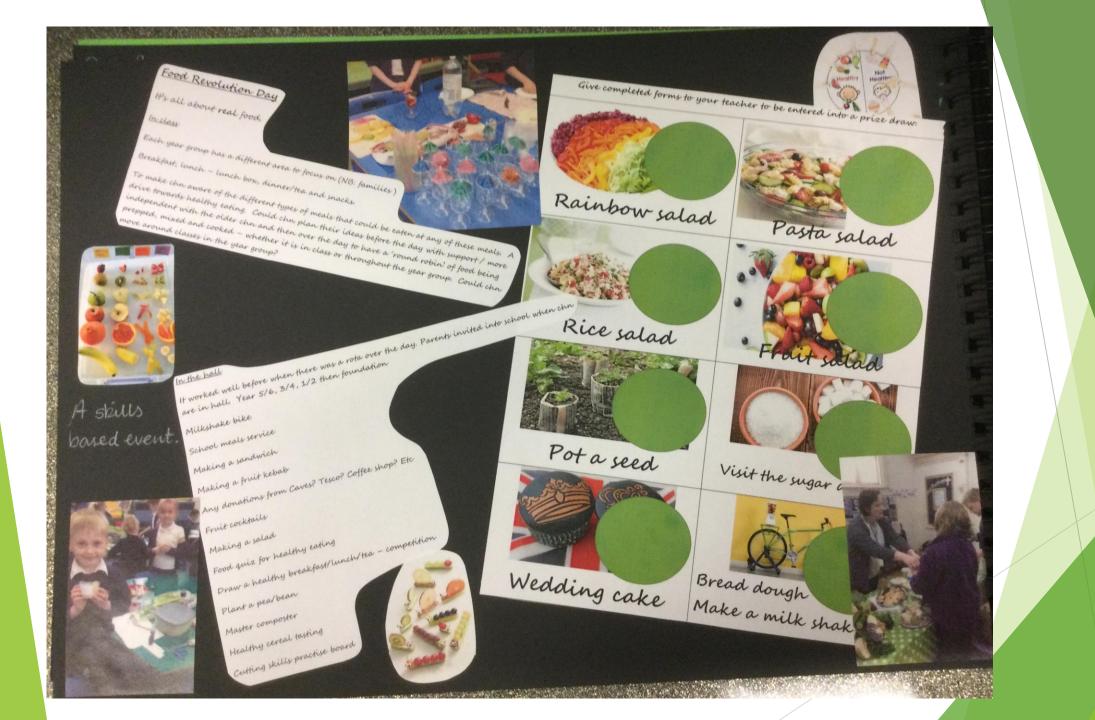
Food for life teaches a wholesome way of life and we fully endorse it.

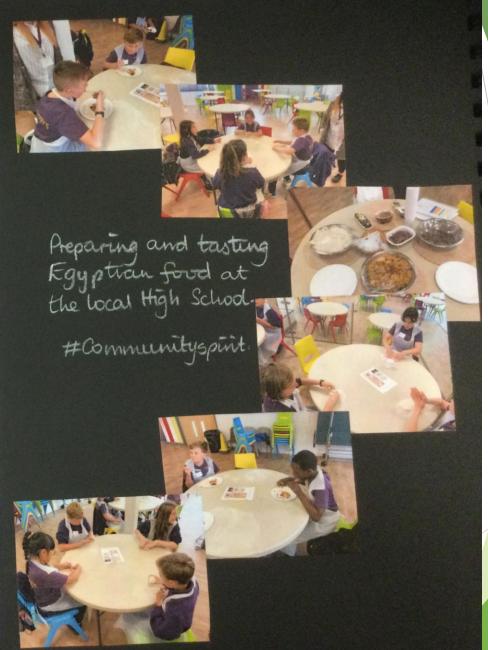

Incredients.

100s plain flows, 2 large eggs,

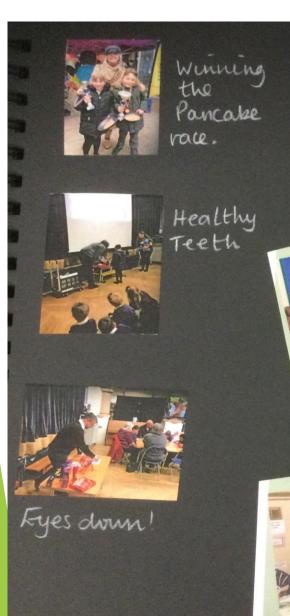
finch of salt,

1they swoflower/vegetable oil (flue extra for frying) lemon wedges/sugar

Method

- 1. Put the flows, both eggs, 300 ml milk, 1 they oil and salt into a boul and which to a smooth batter.
- 2. Rest for 30 mine
- 3. Place a medium frying pan over a medium heat and wipe with oiled kitchen paper.
- 4. When bot, four in latter and cook for 1 minute until golden.
- 5. Serve with a filling of your choice.

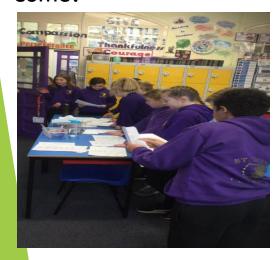
