

YEAR FIVE AND SIX EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO BOSWORTH BATTLEFIELD



Objectives

St Mary's Church of England Primary School has a strong commitment to the added value of learning beyond the school premises by the use of carefully planned Educational Visits. Every child has an entitlement to a wide range of educational experiences. St Mary's Church of England Primary school has a role to provide a broad and balanced curriculum that promotes spiritual, moral, social, cultural, mental and physical development and prepares young people for the opportunities and experiences of adult life. Each year the school will arrange a number of activities that take place off the school site and/or out of school hours, which support the aims of the school, as well as providing first hand experiences and bringing the curriculum to life.

<u>Aims</u>

To support our learning in History, we have organised a visit to Bosworth Battlefield for children in year 5/6 on Friday 4th October 2024. During our visit, the children will learn about the famous battle that took place in 1485, marking the end of the Wars of the Roses. This was a pivotal moment in history that led to the rise of the Tudor dynasty

<u>Itinerary</u>

The children will be travelling by coach to the Bosworth Battlefield Heritage Centre. Through interactive displays, a guided tour, and activities, they'll gain a deeper understanding of the battle, the people involved, and how it shaped our country's history. There will also be an opportunity for the children to visit the gift shop. If your child would like to bring money to spend, please ensure it is no more than £10. We will eat lunch at the centre and return back to school by the end of the day. Children need to be collected at the normal time.

Lunch

All children will need a packed lunch (in a disposable bag) and a water bottle.

- All educational visits are led and supported by competent adults.
- There are qualified first aiders supporting us on this trip.
- All adults supervising this educational experience have a DBS certificate.
- There will be a minimum of 6 adults with the class on this trip.
