

## Sports Premium Action Plan 2023-2024

At St. Mary's C of E Primary School, physical education and healthy lifestyles have always been given a high profile across the school; this is despite our limited playground space and no school field.

During the last academic year children participated in local and county wide competitions in the following sports:

This year we are particularly proud of our overall participation in sports clubs and have competed in a number of competitions with improved success. Once again the school has received sports premium funding from the government.

### **Purpose of the funding**

There are 5 key indicators that school expect to see improvement across:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5-18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased knowledge and skills of all staff in the teaching of PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

## Aims of the Action Plan:

- To ensure that all children have access to high quality PE
- To further improve the quality of teaching and learning of PE across the school
- To provide exciting and challenging physical activity opportunities
- To continue to develop sporting links with other schools and across the county
